What is a SILC Authority?

- They are "new": SILC authorities were added to the Rehab Act in 2014.
- They are optional: SILC authorities are discretionary.
- They are limited: The Rehab Act provides a list of activities that a SILC can do if they are in the State Plan for Independent Living.

What is allowed in the law?

- Work with Centers for Independent Living to coordinate services with public and private entities to improve services provided to individuals with disabilities
- Conduct resource development activities to support the activities described in the approved SPIL and/or to support the provision of independent living services by Centers for Independent Living; and
- Perform such other functions, <u>consistent</u> with the purpose of this part and <u>comparable</u> to other functions described in section 705(c) of the Act, as the SILC determines to be appropriate and authorized in the approved SPIL.

NOTE: SILC activities still must comply with all other applicable federal laws

What can this mean in real life?

- Coordination with Centers on improving services for people with disabilities
 - Working with CILs and Managed Care Organizations to ensure community based services are available
 - Working with statewide organizations to improve communication and coordination with CILs during disasters
 - Connecting CILs with your Developmental Disabilities Council, Area Agencies on Aging, Aging and Disability Resource Centers, etc.
 - Advocating for additional services and better coordination to your state's legislature or agencies

What can this mean in real life?

Resource Development

- Helping CILs directly secure funds or in-kind resources (contracts, grants, equipment, supplies, volunteers, etc.)
- Securing and administering grants to be awarded to CILs as subrecipients, partners, contractors, etc.
- Securing new resources to conduct SPIL activities such as outreach and activities described in the Goals and Objectives

What can this mean in real life?

- Board Directed Activities (within the limits of the law and the SPIL)
 - Conducting outreach activities to under or unserved populations
 - Activities to further the SPIL Goals and Objectives
 - Activities associated with ensuring your SILC appointments, resources,
 - Activities associated with developing, monitoring, and evaluating the SPIL

Things to consider...

- What does the law (Rehab Act) say?
 - Section 705 of the Rehab Act as amended in 2014
 - 45 CFR § 1329.16
- What does your state's approved SPIL say?
 - Check in Section 1, Goals and Objectives, to see how the SILC will support the Goals, Objectives, and Activities of the Network.
 - Check in Section 2, Services, to see if the SILC has a defined role and activity in outreach to specific populations and coordination of services.
 - Check in Section 5, SILC, to see if your state mentioned how the SILC will perform it's duties and authorities.
- What does the SILC board say?
 - Has the SILC provided direction?
